Notes from the Guild President on Virtual Meetings

Like so many organizations around the world, we have turned to virtual meetings via Zoom in order to stay connected. The QUILT Inc. Board at its November meeting voted to continue using Zoom meeting through June 2021. We hope to be able to meet in person in September 2021. When we are holding Zoom meetings, please watch for emails regarding registering for guild meetings and emails containing links to meetings (guild, workshop, open sew). These are very important and may come the week before a meeting.

For the Show and Share portion of Zoom guild meetings, send your photos to Mary Phillips at mphill2@nycap.rr.com by the Sunday before the guild meeting. Your photos will be compiled into a presentation. You will have the opportunity to talk about your quilts during the meeting. Limit of 4 photos, which may include detail shots of your items.

I know that we are all looking forward to meeting in person, but remember that we are all learning new ways of doing things. While Zoom meetings are not in person, they do have some advantages:

- You always have a front-row seat; no heads in your way.
- No traveling or worrying about the weather, usually.
- You do not have to turn on the video (although we love to see your face).
- If you have hearing issues, you can use earbuds to help make the sound clearer.
- You can participate, even if you are away from home, as long as you have a device.

It is cheaper for the guild to have speakers via Zoom; there are no travel costs and we can invite speakers who live further away. Since the guild does not charge workshop participants for the travel costs, the cost of workshops will not be less; we only charge what the teacher charges for the workshop. From the teacher's point of view, they are often investing in time and equipment to give good Zoom workshops, so their workshop fees are not going down.

Zoom workshops have these advantages:

- You have an opportunity to learn something new from your home.
- There is no need to lug your sewing machine.

- If you forget supplies or change your mind during a workshop, you are home and can get what you need.
- You can socialize and sew.
- The teacher can help one on one.
- The teacher can show closeups which you can easily see.
- If portions have been prerecorded, the teacher can easily replay, if needed.

With Open Sew via Zoom:

- You can quilt right in your home.
- You can socialize and ask for advice and guidance.
- You can come and go as you please.
- You can ask others to share techniques online.

January 2021 Meeting via Zoom

As a result of the reaction to her September Meet our Members presentation, our own Mary Helen Collen will teach us via Zoom how to create String Quilt blocks. This sew-along session will begin after the guild business meeting and last about an hour. We will make four 10" blocks together, from the comfort of our own sewing rooms. Afterwards, the blocks can be combined to make a pillow, or they can become part of a fun quilt. They can also be joined with other guild members' blocks to make a service quilt (or 2 or 6...). Please be prepared for this meeting with the following:

- Four 11" squares of paper, pre-washed muslin, or batting to use as the foundation. (Mary Helen prefers Warm and Natural for her string projects.)
- An assortment of strips of fabric of varying widths (from 3/4" to 2 1/2"). The longest strips should be 15" and you will need 8 of that length (2 for each block). The more mixed the assortment, the more interesting your block will be
- Sewing machine.
- Ruler and rotary cutter for squaring the block.
- Thread a medium gray usually works to blend with all fabrics.

Intentional Large-Scale Paper Piecing — Wings

April 8, 2021: 9:30 am - 12:30 pm

Wings serves as a great introduction to modern, large scale paper piecing. Paper piecing with larger pieces of fabric is in many ways more difficult than paper piecing with small pieces that are more easily handled. Learn some new tricks to make large scale paper piecing work while also learning to place your fabric intentionally to enhance the pattern design. Explore various layouts for a unique quilt top.

Modern Selvage Quilts - Whirlwind

April 9, 2021: 12:30 - 3:30 pm

Have you been saving those precious selvages for ages but aren't quite sure what to do with them? Selvage Whirlwind is a fun modern quilt that make use of a wide range of colored selvages from your collection. There needs to be ½"-1" of fabric beyond the selvage for this project. Learn how best to collect selvages, what makes a selvage design work, and create several selvage blocks sharing selvages with your classmates so you have a wide range of colors.

Pictorial Hand Appliqué - Columbine

May 13, 2021: 9:30 am - 3:30 pm

This workshop demonstrates David's layered, handappliqué technique with simple appliqué shapes using freezer paper templates and liquid starch. The class will cover how he builds his pictorial wall quilts and how to get beautiful details by letting the fabric choices do all the hard work.

Free Motion Quilting – Yes, You CAN Stipple

May 14, 2021: 12:30 - 3:30 pm

This is a beginners' class for learning basic free-motion machine quilting techniques on your own home machine. The class is structured around a series of quilt 'sandwiches' that will get everyone moving! Students will also learn how to adjust tension on their own machine for perfect stitching. Please have machines in clean, working order with a fresh needle installed. Machines must have free-motion quilting ability. Kit includes quilt sandwiches, thread, and needles.

Your quilt should depict anything related to finding peace in our currently troubled world. The year 2020 has given us a historic pandemic, isolation, death, unemployment, mental health problems, an increase in drug overdoses, political division, police brutality, racism, and civil unrest.
