NOTE ABOUT OPEN SEW:

Participation at in-person and Zoom Open Sews has been minimal – as in 3-5 people. As a result, only a few sessions are scheduled for the 2022-2023 Guild year. Make note of the in-person sews on Friday afternoons following the Guild meetings in December 2022 and March 2023. These are great days to work on a project or pin one of your own quilts using the large tables while socializing with friends. Only one Zoom session is scheduled for February 2023, but it is simple to add additional ones which can be on non-Guild meeting/workshop days. Registration Information Q.U.I.L.T., Inc.: Presents An Exposition 2023 Saturday April 29 and Sunday April 30, 2023

Each quilter may submit up to eight (8) entries (quilts and wearable art). There is no limit on the number of pieces that can be judged. Registration forms may be submitted (in person) or postmarked by **Thursday January 5, 2023.**

All quilts must be made by members of Q.U.I.L.T., Inc. Only quilts which have not been exhibited in prior Q.U.I.L.T., Inc. shows may be registered.

REGISTRATION FORM NOTES:

- PRIORITY NUMBER (for displaying quilts): Please assign a number to each item entered, starting with any "judged" items. For example, if I am entering 2 items for judging and 4 that will not be judged, I will number my judged items 1 and 2 and I will number my non-judged items 3, 4, 5, 6. If too many quilt entries are received for display, the PRIORITY NUMBER, registration date, and size limitations will be used to eliminate quilts.
- JUDGED AND NON-JUDGED QUILTS: Any quilt is eligible for judging, including framed quilts. A judged or non-judged quilt consists of two or more layers that are joined together and quilted. Only 100 entries (quilts and wearable art combined) will be accepted for judging. If too many judged quilt entries are received, the PRIORITY NUMBER and registration date will be used to eliminate quilts.
- JUDGED AND NON-JUDGED WEARABLE ART: A judged, or non-judged wearable art entry should include in its design, construction or embellishment one or more quilt techniques (piecing, appliqué, quilting, etc.) in some part of the garment. Batting or middle layer is not required.
- •CHALLENGE PIECES: There is no fee or requirement for a description for the challenge pieces.
- **SUBMISSIONS:** (judged and non-judged):
 - o a separate registration form for each item entered in the Show,
- o a 4"X6" photo of the entire quilt to help the display committee plan for the Show. Photo maybe printed on plain printer/copier paper and trimmed to 4"X6". Please include the following information on the back of each photo: your name, phone number, priority number, title of entry, and dimensions of quilt____"wide____"long. Please use a paper clip or staple, but not tape to attach your photo to the registration form. (All of your entries may be mailed in one envelope.)
 - o a check for total amount due (only one check covering all submissions)
 - o Self-addressed stamped envelope (SASE) (only one SASE covering all submissions)

All entries must be submitted or postmarked by **Thursday January 5, 2023**. If you are still working on your quilt or wearable art and are reasonably confident about completing it by the quilt delivery date; **Monday April 17, 2023**, submit your registration form by **January 5, 2023**. Quilt delivery will be at the Delmar Reformed Church, or by special arrangement with Julie-Ann Fortran or Mary Helen Collen.

- **DISPLAY CARD INFORMATION:** (Guide for brief description) Please keep your description to 35 words or less. Include the following information:
 - 1. a) Design/pattern source Original (must be a new creation and not a copy of a previous work). If a pattern is used, please list pattern information including magazine, book or workshop, project title and author/instructor.
 - 2. b) Technique Pieced by hand or machine; appliquéd by hand or machine; mixed media, such as embroidery, beading, stamping, etc.
 - 3. c) Interesting details—You might describe your inspiration; why you made the quilt and/or for whom; anything unusual/interesting back, etc.
 - 4. d) Special details (used for displaying in the Show)
 - 5. e) Details entered as part of the questions on the registration form, do not need to be repeated in the 35 words description.
 - 6. f) A description is not required for challenge pieces.
 - LABELING, HANGING SLEEVES, PILLOWCASES, DELIVERY, PICKUP: Information that includes a number for each item will be sent via your self- addressed stamped envelope after receipt of the Registration Forms. (NOTE: You need only send ONE stamped self-addressed envelope regardless of number of registration forms.) Sleeves must be at least 4" deep. Quilts need to be delivered in a cloth bag; one quilt or item per bag. Please do not use a plastic bag. Required labels MUST be present on the bag and on the quilt. We are unable to accept quilts delivered without a cloth bag or the required details. Details will be mailed after registration ends.
 - **FEES:** There is an entry fee for each non-judged item and for each judged item, but not for each challenge item. If the committee finds it necessary to further limit the number of entries, your entry fee for that item will be returned to you. Entry fees: \$7per non-judged item and \$10 per judged item. All registration forms must be postmarked, or hand delivered by Thursday January 5, 2023. Please mail registration forms to Q.U.I.L.T., Inc., PO Box 523, Delmar, NY 12054-0523.
 - **INSURANCE:** Q.U.I.L.T., Inc. will provide security and insurance from the time your entry is in our possession until the item is signed out after the Show. The maximum for which an item may be insured is \$1,000 unless you have an appraisal or sales record documenting a higher value. The amount paid for a loss, without an appraisal or sales slip will be determined by the insurance company, based on a recent sales record of an item of like kind and quality. All exhibitors should have a high-quality, full shot of the entry and a close-up shot of details of the entry in case of loss. Since our cost for this insurance depends on the total value of the insured items, we ask that you carefully estimate the value of your entry. While Q.U.I.L.T., Inc. will make every effort to protect your entry, it will be your responsibility to validate any insurance claim with the insurance company.
 - MAXIMUM QUILT SIZE: 116" wide by 120" long. We will have a limited number of these very large spaces.
