#### Announcing the June 2024 Quilt Challenge: Read a Quilt

Take a few pieces of fabric, thread, your quilter's creative imagination and bring to life your vision or impression of a scene from a book you have read. You may have read the book before the announcement of the challenge. Include in the explanation the name of the book and a 35 word description of the scene you are depicting. The quilt can be either a traditional or a non-traditional design and will be voted on by members at the June 2024 meeting. Prizes will be awarded to the top three viewer's choice in the two different categories.

To be eligible for this challenge, the quilt must:

- \*have been started after the announcement of the challenge
- \* have a perimeter of less than 144 inches
- \* be finished (quilted and bound)
- \* have no uncovered identifying labels

#### Placemat Project

#### Placemat Chairs Lorraine Doyno Evans and Ruth Kvale

Join the guild's Placemat Project! Quilted placemats are collected at guild meetings throughout the year and are distributed in December to local organizations serving the elderly, shut-ins, and other people in need. Our placemats bring much joy to the recipients. We donate hundreds a year!

Any cheerful design is welcome. The recommended finished size is 14" X 18". A collection bin will be at the back table. Trying out a new technique? Turn that unwanted test block into a placemat. Got unwanted orphan blocks? Those could be turned into placemats as well.

In 2023, the committee collected and distributed 355 placemats this December compared to 461 in 2022. Six agencies received the placemats:

#### Service

Service Chair Diane Millson

Service quilts benefit the many organizations that receive them, and members as they reduce their stash! If you like to sew, but you have inundated your family and friends with quilts, consider making one for service. We like them about 54" x 72", but can take them if they are a little larger. Baby and kid size quilts are also welcome. In March and April, we will be concentrating on red, white and blue quilts. Community Hospice has asked for Veteran quilts either lap size of 35" X 40" or hospital bed size of 66" X 90" in red white and blue. Camp Erin quilts should be 48" X 72".

Sharon Gormley is collecting quilts for the NICU to cover incubators to keep the light out and to swaddle the tiny babies. Quilts should 36" X 36" or 24" X 24". Sharon recommends a light batting or flannel to keep the light out.

Anne Carelli-O'Brien of **US Community for Refugees and Immigrants** (USCRI) <u>is now accepting quilts for immigrants again.</u> She is looking for quilt for twin and full size quilts. (Mattress size for a twin is 38" X 75" and size for a full size is 54" X 75") She is also able to accept small wall hangings for kid's rooms like maybe 36" X 36".

Service has kits already made up and ready to sew. They are available before each meeting or available upon request.

For 2023, service received 95 quilts and 17 fidget quilts from members. 77 quilts and 29 fidget quilts were donated including 4 quilts to Camp Erin. As of January 5<sup>th</sup>, there are 54 quilts and 3 fidget quilts available for donation. Some of the other organizations quilts were donated to are:
